NEW YEAR OF GRACE The Year of Mark's Gospel

Mark is the primary evangelist for Year B of the three-year Lectionary cycle. His account is the earliest of the four Gospels, although is is second to Matthew in its placement in the New Testament. The evangelist, Mark, wrote for an audience composed



primarily of non-Jewish people living outside of the Holy Land. We can date the Gospel according to Mark somewhere between AD 60 and 70.

On our side, we have a similar force so deep within us that we do not have much control over it. We call this force the drive to grow up. No one can come to the maturity of a human person or the maturity of a Christian except through constant change and transformation.
