# **RCIA Re-Starts this Wednesday**

The resumption of the RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults) takes place on the coming Wednesday, 28th February, at 7.30pm in the loungeroom of the Presbytery. I am delighted to announce and very grateful that Anthony Higgins and Ana Laughton will share the coordinating leadership of the process. At the present time, the Parish Office has a record of four people who have expressed interest in the RCIA. It is not unusual for enquirers to be accompanied by someone who may be their sponsor. Though as pointed out in recent bulletin messages it may be that parishioners, choosing to be supportive of the process by attending the meetings, assume the role of sponsor. The whole parish community, of course, is meant to be supportive of the RCIA process, at least in the way of prayer.

What does it mean to be a Sponsor?

To be a sponsor means that to serve as companion, guide, model and witness. The RCIA should not be seen as just involving a chosen few, or just as another parish organisation. It is an expression of the Church, and as such, touches all of us. The RCIA really is a way of being Church. It requires participation, involvement and celebration.

# St. Mary's Parish Music and Singing

In coming to St. Mary's Parish, it had been arranged that Shanti Michael would lend support in the role of Music Coordinator. I am grateful that Shanti willingly undertook this role and thereby serve the parish community both at St. Margaret's and St. Mary's. **Ronita** is 22. She lives with her husband and two children in a barangay (local district) in Quezon City, which is situated in Metro Manila in the Philippines.

Ronita left school when she became pregnant as a teenager. This could have had a life-long impact on her ability to find work and provide for her family but, thankfully, she heard about the Alternative Learning System (ALS) program run by the Faithful Companions of Jesus (FCJ), Caritas Australia's local partners in the Philippines.

Through the FCJ, Ronita was able to re-enrol in her studies and continue learning in a safe and flexible environment – even with the arrival of her second child.

After completing her ALS classes, Ronita went on to earn her Grade 12 Senior High School Diploma. With her new diploma, Ronita has now secured a job at a call centre and is looking to a brighter future for her whole family.

"I have now graduated senior school and I am so proud of myself," she said. "I feel hopeful for the future... Now it's not impossible for me to achieve my dream... Thank you."

# **2nd Sunday of Lent**

# **FIRST READING** Gen 22:1-2,9-13,15-18

A reading from the book of Genesis

God put Abraham to the test. 'Abraham, Abraham' he called. 'Here I am' he replied. 'Take your son,' God said 'your only child Isaac, whom you love, and go to the land of Moriah. There you shall offer him as a burnt offering, on a mountain I will point out to you.'

When they arrived at the place God had pointed out to him, Abraham built an altar there, and arranged the wood. Then he bound his son Isaac and put him on the altar on top of the wood. Abraham stretched out his hand and seized the knife to kill his son.

But the angel of the Lord called to him from heaven. 'Abraham, Abraham' he said. 'I am here' he replied. 'Do not raise your hand against the boy' the angel said. 'Do not harm him, for now I know you fear God. You have not refused me your son, your only son.' Then looking up, Abraham saw a ram caught by its horns in a bush. # GOSPEL Mark 9:2-10

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark Jesus took with him Peter and James and John and led them up a high mountain where they could be alone by themselves. There in their presence he was transfigured: his clothes became dazzlingly white, whiter than any earthly bleacher could make them. Elijah appeared to them with Moses; and they were talking with Jesus. Then Peter spoke to Jesus: 'Rabbi,' he said 'it is wonderful for us to be here; so let us make three tents, one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah.' He did not know what to say; they were so frightened. And a cloud came, covering them in shadow; and there came a voice from the cloud, 'This is my Son, the Beloved. Listen to him.' Then suddenly, when they looked round, they saw no one with them any more but only Jesus.

As they came down from the mountain he warned them to tell no one what they had seen, until after the Son of Man had risen from the dead. They observed the warning faithfully, though among themselves they discussed what 'rising from the dead' could mean.
